### **BUSINESS TRIP TO NIGERIA**

## ABUJA - LAGOS 2–6 September 2013

#### Nigerian economy

With a population of 158 million people, Nigeria is the largest country in Africa and accounts for 47% of West Africa's population. It is also the biggest oil exporter in Africa, with the largest natural gas reserves in the continent. Nigeria is Africa's 2<sup>nd</sup> biggest economy (behind South Africa) in terms of GDP. Together they account for one-half of sub-Saharan Africa's GDP.

According to a recent UNCTAD study, Nigeria was in 2011 with 9bn USD the top destination in Africa in terms of FDI flows (=20% of all FDI to Africa, ahead of South Africa which received 6bn USD).

Over the last ten years, Nigeria has been carrying an ambitious reform agenda. The economy responded with strong growth between 2003 and 2012 – averaging 6-7% per annum. Growth is expected to continue in the same range, whilst inflation is expected to come down to 9.5% in 2013 from 12% in 2012. Growth continued to be broad based, oriented primarily toward the domestic market, and driven by strong performance of the agricultural, trade, telecommunications, and manufacturing sectors. Strong economic growth, however, has not translated into higher employment rates. Employment remains the major issue for Nigeria with an estimated 50 million underemployed youth.

The Government has recently engaged in a vision 20:2020 (target = become a top 20 economy in the word by 2010). The corresponding transformation agenda includes massive investments into infrastructure: energy, transport, security and food production/security.

#### **Political context**

Nigeria's population is made up of about 200 ethnic groups, 500 indigenous languages, and two major religions — Islam and Christianity.

In April 2011, Nigeria held its fourth consecutive national elections, further consolidating the transition from military to democratic rule that began in 1999. The elections signified substantial progress in Nigeria's electoral and democratic development, and were characterized by observers as freest and fairest in Nigeria's history.

Internationally, Nigeria continues to be a leading player in the African Union, the New Partnership for Africa's Development (NEPAD), and in the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS).

#### **Swiss – Nigerian business relations**

Nigeria is Switzerland's 5<sup>th</sup> most important trading partner in Africa (behind South Africa, Libya, Algeria and Egypt). 60-70 Swiss companies are currently active in Nigeria, employing around 4'000 people.

A recent survey done by the Swiss Embassy in Abuja amongst 15 Swiss companies with activities in Nigeria showed a rather positive picture: the companies are in most cases pursuing a long-term strategy, have invested substantially in their business in recent years and are expecting on average 10-15% growth per annum.




